- Prices are to be single bottle retail or part of a mixed case, excluding delivery or collection charges.

The people attending then choose: the best single wine of the evening; the wine with the best potential for developing with age; the wine which offers the best value for money; and the best overall region.

Sandy Gretton will provide a light supper after the tasting.

The representative of the winning region goes on to organise the next red wine challenge, to take place in about six months time.
